FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. When would I need to consult a specialty surgeon?

A. Most primary care veterinarians utilize the services of a specialty surgeon when a pet requires:

- advanced procedures or those not commonly performed
- procedures requiring specialized equipment
- procedures requiring intense monitoring both during and after surgery
- procedures carrying more risk to the life of your pet

Q. Do I need a referral to use your surgical services?

A. Yes, our office requires a written Surgical Referral Form to be completed by your primary care veterinarian. This form is available on our website and may be faxed, emailed, or brought with you to your appointment along with any pertinent medical history.

Q. Do you offer any billing services?

A. We do not offer a billing service. Payment is expected at the time of service. We accept cash, Care Credit, and all major credit cards. For more information on our payment policies, please contact our office.

Q. After surgery will my pet stay overnight?

A. The majority of our patients require at least one overnight stay. Our emergency service (APVES) provides overnight care for all surgery patients. You are free to call at any time during your pet's hospitalization for an update by a technician.

Q. After Surgery, will my pet return for follow-up care?

A. Yes, although the type of surgery performed always dictates when and how often your pet will need to be re-evaluated, as well as recovery time; all of our surgical patients follow up with the doctor a minimum of once.
